### WHAT IS OPEN ACCESS

"The author(s) and right holder(s) of such contributions grant(s) to all users a free, irrevocable, worldwide, right of access to, and a license to copy, use, distribute, transmit and display the work publicly and to make and distribute derivative works, in any digital medium for any responsible purpose, subject to proper attribution of authorship (...)."

### WHO BENEFITS FROM OPEN ACCESS

- Scholars in universities
- Libraries, schools, educators, the public in general
- > Publishers
- The private sector



### WAYS TO PUBLISH OPEN ACCESS

- Publish in an Open Access Journal (might require author payments)
- = Gold Open Access
- Pay to publish open access in a subscription journal ("hybrid")
- = Hybrid Open Access
- Deposit your (toll access) article in an Open Access repository (considering embargo periods and the right version):
  - institutional repository
  - disciplinary repositories (e.g. PubMedCentral, arXiv)
  - = Green Open Access



## CREATIVE-COMMONS-LICENSES (CC-LICENSES)

- Copyright licenses
- Helps share your work
- Simple and standardized way for the reader to use and share the cc-licensed work



### **FUNDING AGENCIES (EXAMPLES)**

Funding body	Guidelines
<u>FWF</u>	Open access mandatory Articles () have to be archived in a repository  Fund gold and hybrid open access Green open access allowed if embargo < 12 months
Horizon 2020 ERC	Open access mandatory Articles () have to be archived in a repository  Fund gold and hybrid open access Green open access allowed if embargo < 6 (STM) or 12 (humanities, life sciences) months



### OPEN ACCESS INITIATIVE COALITION S

#### 10 principles, such as:

- All publications have to be open access & under a free license (CC BY)
- Green Open Access possible but difficult:

"Immediately upon publication, authors deposit the final published version of a scholarly publication (Version of Record (VoR)) or an Author's Accepted Manuscript (AAM), in a Plan S compliant repository. The document is made available immediately open access (with no embargo) under a CC BY license."

Role of archives and repositories (long-term archiving)

Effective for all publications within projects starting with 01.01.2020

Signed by FWF (Austrian Funder), European Commission

- An institutional repository
- = Green Open Access
- Negotiations with publishers\*
- = Hybrid Open Access
- Funding of individual articles in Gold Open Access journals ("Publication Fund")\*
- = Gold Open Access

\*Not for project-funded articles (e.g. FWF, ERC)

## GOLD & HYBRID OPEN ACCESS



### **OPEN ACCESS AGREEMENTS**

- Publishing open access in subscription based journals at no additional costs
  - No double dipping (paying for both reading & publishing) due to specific negotiations
- Open access deals negotiated via the <u>Austrian</u> <u>Academic Library Consortium</u>
- All current agreements listed at <u>https://www.ub.tuwien.ac.at/eng/openaccess</u> and <u>https://www.konsortien.at/openaccess-en.asp</u>



### **PUBLICATION FUND: GUIDELINES**

- Only for members of TU Wien (corresponding author)
- Journal has to be listed in the "Directory of Open Access Journals" (www.doaj.org)
- Article processing charges (APCs) < 2000 EUR</p>
- publication costs not covered by external resources or funded projects
- Open license
- Funding acknowledgement



## GREEN OPEN ACCESS: REPOSITORY



### **WHY A REPOSITORY?**

- Centralized collecting and archiving of documents
- Available freely online (worldwide)
- Persistent identifier (URN, Handle, DOI...)
- Indexing / included in search engines (Library catalogue, Google Scholar, BASE, OpenAIRE...)
- Comply with funding agency requirements
- Long-term archiving



### **TYPES OF REPOSITORIES**

- Institutional repository
  - Document server maintained by instutiton
  - Mostly limited to members of the institution
  - Example: reposiTUm (TU Wien)
- Disciplinary repository
  - Supra-institutional, subject-based
  - Directories: <u>OpenDOAR</u>, <u>re3data</u> (research data)
  - Example: <u>PubMed Central</u>, <u>arXiv</u>



### SERVICES AT TU WIEN: REPOSITUM

- Institutional repository since 2015
- Hosted by Austrian Library Network and Service Ltd
- Website: <a href="https://repositum.tuwien.ac.at/">https://repositum.tuwien.ac.at/</a>



### REPOSITUM

- Basic information:
  - Documents: ~13.300 (May 2019)
    - All electronic theses (master...)
    - Self-archived versions of closed access articles
    - Sold Open Access articles, funded by the library
    - Books (digitalised, Academic Press)
    - Additionally hosting
      - 2 gold open access journals
      - 2 gold open access series
  - All metadata delivered to library system (and therefore library catalogue)
  - Persistent Identifier: URNs



### CHECKING AN ARTICLE FOR SELF-ARCHIVING

- **)** Checks:
  - Author's contract
  - Sherpa/Romeo
  - Website Publisher
- Needed information:
  - Version of manuscript
  - Embargo
  - Additional information to include?
    - Creative commons license
    - Citation
    - Specific wording for reuse
  - > Pictures etc.
